

Project Update

Pleasant Hill Road Repaving Project

Date: 10/09/20

This week, the Contractor finished the removal and replacement of damaged portions of the sidewalks and removal and reconstruction of handicap ramps to accommodate new ramps.

Starting this Sunday, October 11, the Contractor will begin the night work phase of the project where he will be working from 7 pm until 4 am. This work will continue through Thursday, October 15. The schedule is as follows:

Sunday Night

Remove the existing surface of the road, to a depth of 3 inches, in the northbound direction from Mount Diablo Boulevard to Stanley Boulevard.

Monday Night

Remove the existing surface of the road, to a depth of 3 inches, in the southbound direction from Deer Hill Road to Mount Diablo Boulevard.

Tuesday Night

Place SAMI seal over all of Pleasant Hill Road from Mount Diablo Boulevard to Deer Hill Road. Please note that this sealing process produces a rough surface. Please observe the reduced speed signs and refrain from driving faster than 25 mph on the newly sealed street.

Wednesday Night

Place final layer of asphalt pavement over the northbound lanes of Pleasant Hill Road from Mount Diablo Boulevard to Stanley Boulevard.

Thursday Night

Place final layer of asphalt pavement over the southbound lanes of Pleasant Hill Road from Mount Diablo Boulevard to Deer Hill Road.

Please note that one lane of traffic in each direction will be available at all times. However, some of the freeway on- and off ramps will be closed. Detours will be in place to provide motorists with alternate routes.

The road will have a rough surface until such time as the final layer of asphalt is placed. Please note the street will be posted for reduced traffic speeds. Please be mindful of the posted speed limits and the rough surface of the road.

While the work is in progress, please lend us your cooperation and extra patience and be alert to equipment, workers, and traffic.
